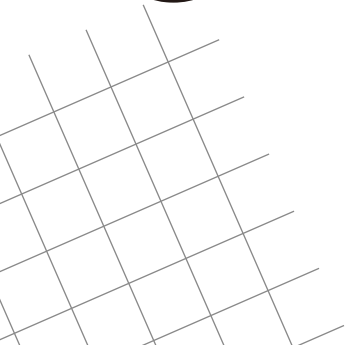


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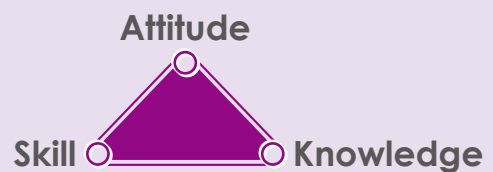
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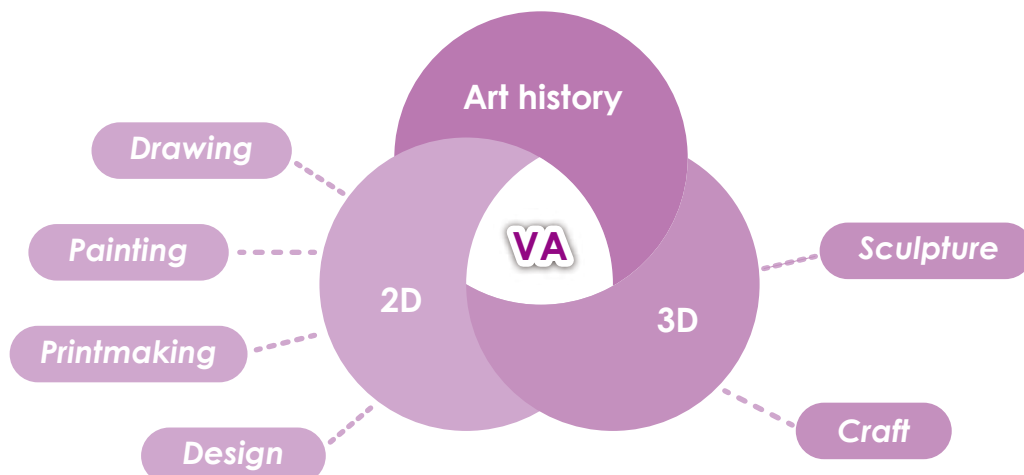
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VA CURRICULUM

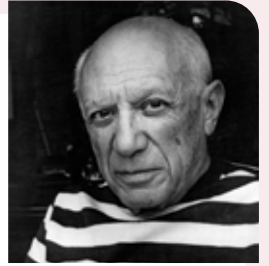
Art Movement: Cubism

Art Movement: *Illustration*

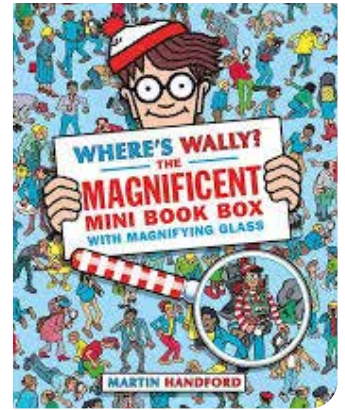
Artist: *Martin Handford*

Students learn to create their own puzzles, from character design, perspective consideration, to the use of colours.

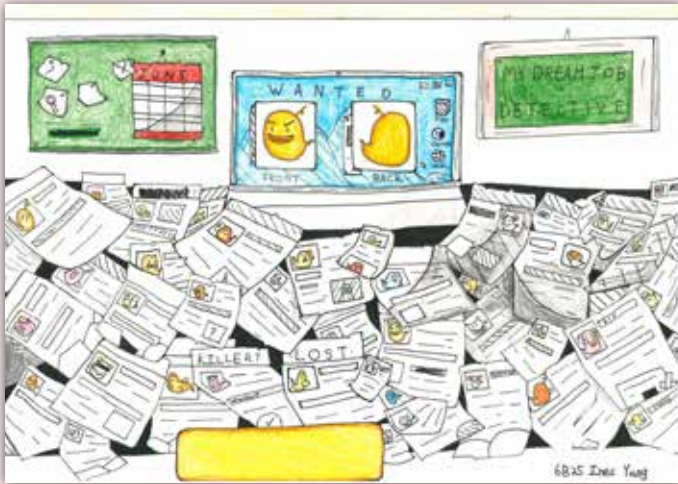

The reason that I draw Albert Einstein is because he made great contribution to science, his works are so inspiring.

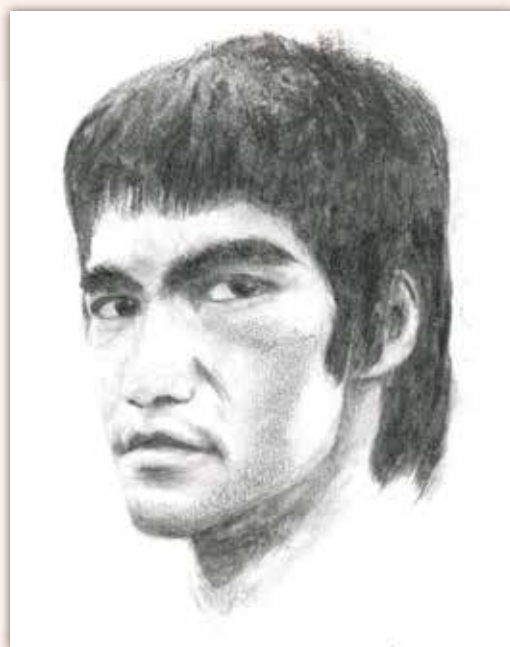
