

I joined a programme for gifted students some years ago, and there was a project that involved writing an algorithm to generate a virtual maze. It was really hard and took me nearly three weeks to complete. With perseverance, I managed to complete the project."

Besides his academic success, Ranok has also developed a love for the Chinese drum. "I joined the Chinese drum team when I discovered this instrument in the Multiple Intelligence Programme. Chinese drumming has taught Ranok more than just musical skills. It has also led him to remain humble in learning. "Always have a humble and open mind when exploring new talents or abilities. You can achieve more and reach new heights by staying open-minded to learning new things."

Going back to school after working for a few years, Sam is now studying Doctor of Veterinary Medicine at Sydney University in Australia - one of the leading schools in veterinary education.

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

"There was a moment I said to myself, 'This is not the career I desire.' Therefore, I asked for my family's support in returning to school to study veterinary medicine in Australia. I had dreamt of studying veterinary medicine since I was a child, but it was a bit far from reality, given my performance in secondary school. I am thankful to have supportive parents who fully support my dream."






Studying veterinary medicine is no easy task, let alone returning to the school environment after a few years of work. Sam shares some of his obstacles and ways to overcome them. "The major difficulty for me is the language barrier. Being in a thoroughly English-speaking environment, I need to overcome this. Luckily, I think I developed a good foundation in WFJLPS. The veterinary education here includes a foundation course which requires students to get a high score to pass. During some of the more demanding days swamped by numerous deadlines and academic requirements - I couldn't help but think about giving up. But sometimes, you have to bite the bullet and carry on."

Despite graduating a long time ago, when the swimming pool wasn't there yet, Sam keeps a WhatsApp group to communicate with his classmates. "They have regular gatherings, and I know some classmates still stay in touch with the teachers. I would like to express my gratitude to Mr. Wong and Miss Chan. Mr. Wong was my P.E. teacher, and Miss Chan was my English teacher in primary school. Primary school life in WFJLPS was a happy and enjoyable one."









Sam will continue his study in veterinary medicine in Australia. "I will continue to study and explore more in Australia." What words of advice would Sam give to his fellow WFJLPS students? "Work hard when you are young. Some subjects may not seem directly useful, but every effort counts, and you won't know when you will need to use them. Many subjects and knowledge at this stage are the building blocks for future studies. Like mathematics, I didn't realise it was essential to veterinary medicine in some aspects. Never underestimate the usefulness of every subject.
