School Report 2012-2013



Background

The school's sponsoring body is Wofoo Foundation Ltd., a charitable non-government subvented organization established by Dr. Joseph Lee in May 1997. The Foundation aims at providing social services and is committed to the betterment of the Hong Kong community. It focuses on the needs of the young and the elderly, and in response to the 2000 Education Reform, it started to offer its support to the children of Hong Kong in the provision of quality education. Since early childhood education is the basis for life education, the Foundation chose to open a school at the primary level under the direct subsidy scheme. The W F Joseph Lee Primary School was founded in September 2002 against this background.

Philosophy

It is our belief that the overall aims of education are to enable every child to attain all-around development in the domains of ethics, intellect, physique, social skills and aesthetics. Therefore, along with the academic learning, education in the new Millennium should also involve the enhancement of self-esteem, social interaction and responsibility, personal growth, creative imagination, and independent thinking. It is only through the integration of these diverse skills that our future generations can be properly prepared to meet their challenges.

Vision

Our school is an exemplary learning organization wherein every member achieves one's best.

Mission

Our mission is to foster the learning and development of children in a pleasant, creative and caring environment.

Objectives

We are committed to cultivate in our students the following qualities and aspirations:

1. Sound and solid education foundation
2. Be biliterate
3. Be able to think logically
4. Be curious and show innovation in studies
5. Be healthy in mind and body
6. Have a unique disposition
7. Have commitment towards society
8. Have knowledge and appreciation of Chinese and foreign cultures
9. Have basic computer knowledge

We hope all our parents can be with the children during their growing years by:

1. Offering great attention to the children
2. Offering close family relationships
3. Having happy experiences as parents
4. Offering support to the missions and policies of the school

We hope that our school can have an effect on and function well in the community by:

Our School

We are a direct subsidy primary school, adopting the management mode of school based management (SBM). The majority of our students come from comparatively well off families living in Yuen Long, Tuen Mun and Tin Shui Wai in the New Territories. About 70% of them come to school by school bus, the rest by private car or on foot.

With 5 classes in each level, we have altogether 30 classes. We are housed in a 7-storey Y2K designed building standing on 6 200 square metres in northern Tin Shiu Wai, New Territories. The school is equipped with 30 standard classrooms, 1 hall, 1 library, 1 dancing room, 2 basketball courts and 5 special rooms for teaching information technology, language, general studies, music and art. One multipurpose room has been converted into a multi-media learning centre with 36 computers. With ample resources, we are able to provide a happy and motivating learning environment for our students.

Following the guidelines laid out by the EDB, our school-based curriculum infuses the concept of multiple intelligences learning. It also adopts a trilingual and biliterate approach to teaching to enhance students' language skills in communication and learning. As for pastoral care, the whole school approach is being practised.

Achievements and Reflections on Major Concerns

Priority Task 1:

To enhance Teaching & Learning Effectiveness

Achievements

1. Implementation of Higher Order Thinking skills

All teachers were required to employ teaching strategies such as 3Cs (Critical Thinking, Creativity and Collaborative skills) and the 13 HOTs in their lessons. Through peer lesson observations and the work of students, teachers had a better understanding of how good practices are implemented. A paradigm shift was exhibited in their daily teaching, reflecting the use of higher-order thinking ('HOT') skills and promoting the three core elements of critical thinking, creativity and collaboration in their lessons.

2. Catering for learning differences:

The 'Potential Realization Programme' (PRP) was reorganized to nurture students' talents in a more systematic way. The 'Elite Training Programme', off-site programmes and different school teams were arranged after-school for high achievers.

Chinese, English and Mathematics remedial classes were implemented for all grades. The teacher-student ratio was relatively small (1:15) in remedial classes for weak students. Homework tuition class, speech therapy and learning camp provided learning support in reading & writing for the less able students. The school also employed both a social worker and a Student Guidance Teacher (SGT) to assist teachers in the classroom and to give more support to SEN students.

3. Other Learning Experience (OLE) for students

Different activities were organized for students to promote love and care for the community. (e.g. voluntary and community service for P2-P6, study tour in mainland for P5 and P6.)

In order to create a conducive learning atmosphere for Arts education, students' artwork were displayed everywhere at school. The 1st edition of Art Booklet collecting students' artworks from the whole school was published.

"Good Music" was shared through the school intranet each month to nurture our students' aesthetic sensitivity. Art, Music and PE ambassadors were trained to promote an artistic and healthy lifestyle.

To explore students' potential, they were encouraged to participate in a wide variety of external competitions. e.g. Hong Kong Budding Scientists Award, Primary Science Project Exhibition, Hong Kong Youth Science and the Technology Invention Competition.

Reflection

- a. Through lesson observations, we could see that teachers' skills were generally improved. They were able to employ some of the higher order thinking (HOT) strategies and engage students in active learning. Some of the teachers were able to effectively cater for students' diverse learning needs during the lessons
- b. Some teachers found that single-mindedly focusing on HOT strategies in language teaching is not always effective. The teaching of "reading skills and comprehension strategies" were, to some extent, neglected or overlooked. Therefore, phonics teaching and reading strategies should be reinforced in the coming academic year 2013-14.
- c. More support should be given to novice teachers in order to better guide them in teaching and questioning techniques. It took time for teachers to internalize good lesson planning techniques. It was decided that we will narrow down the focus in peer lesson observation expectations in order to help teachers improve professional skills more effectively in gradual stages. The use of videotaping for self-reflection was also an effective way to give feedback to teachers.

Priority Task 2:

To reinforce School Ethos (Moral, Civic & National Education)

Achievements

1. Reinforcement of School Ethos through the Firefly Scheme

The Fireflies Scheme, designed for all students, is based on the Moral and National Education Curriculum Guidelines. This scheme included Assemblies (螢聚), House League and Buddy Scheme (螢社), Moral lessons (螢亮課) and Sharing with Appreciation (螢光共享). In order to cultivate students' positive values and attitudes through continuous and systematic learning experiences, a Student Log Book was delivered to each student. Students were required to complete different tasks with 7 house mottos throughout the year.

Teachers delivered different themes every week. The objective was to enhance students' understanding of their roles, responsibilities, rights and obligations in 5 different aspects: (1) personal, (2) family, (3) society, (4) country and (5) the world. Teachers infused moral values through discussion on current affairs to enhance students' critical thinking skills from multiple perspectives.

2. Implementation of a Green School Policy

The school promoted 7R – Resist, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Replace, Re-educate, Rethink into daily life. Eco tips were displayed everywhere in the classrooms, corridors and function rooms. Staff and students were frequently reminded to comply with the energy efficiency guidelines. A series of Green projects, talks on environmental protection as well as different school-based “Green” activities were introduced in order to arouse students' awareness of care and respect for the environment.

With the launch of a Green School policy, the e-circular was piloted in the 2nd term. Most parents were supportive. They started to develop a habit of reading the e-circulars on the website.

China Light and Power was invited to conduct an onsite energy audit identifying problem areas. In purchasing devices, the school chose energy saving ones or with environmental friendly labels. Recycling bins, in three colours, were placed in prominent area. This resulted in an increase in the collection of recyclables while the volume of paper used was reduced. Recognition of students' achievement and teachers' effort were received from different public institutions: the Champion Award in the school sector competition organized by China Light Power (CLP) and the Champion Award in LCSD's Greening School Subsidy Scheme- Horticultural Maintenance.

Reflection

- a. The Firefly Scheme was more systematic than before. Most teachers agreed that the scheme was effective in enhancing the school ethos. Over 80% of students completed the tasks listed in the Log Book and achieved the awards. Some teachers noted that the students' attitude became more positive and optimistic. The 7 moral standards will be kept, and explored further in the domains to enhance the whole-person development in the coming year.
- b. Students enjoyed the four different foci in the Firefly lessons every Monday. As for House Leagues and Buddy Meets (螢社), teachers suggested the session should be conducted in a more informal way to create a friendly feeling of meeting their buddies once a month. Meetings can be more interactive, more inquiry based. Casual wear of their respective house colour was suggested for the next academic year to promote House identity.
- c. Reduction in electricity consumption was satisfactory. Many different activities were launched in our School Environmental Campaign throughout the school year. The activities such as "Sticker Design" and "Environmental Key" aroused the awareness of both teachers and students to turn off the lights and air-conditioners when leaving the conference room and classrooms respectively.
- d. With the dynamo bikes installed in the covered playground, competitions among levels and classes were carried out to generate electricity during the recess. Students participated actively. The bikes were also fully used in the sport team training.
- e. The young gardeners were trained in our PRP lessons to label the plants in the school campus. Students enjoyed gardening and they participated in interviews conducted by TVB and magazines. It was suggested that we train the students to be eco-tour ambassadors for visitors.

In brief, with the launch of Firefly and Green School Schemes, a more open, harmonious atmosphere was manifested this year. Students appeared more confident, appreciative and willing to serve others. This phenomenon is most encouraging. The school should continue these worthwhile and sustainable practices.

Priority Task 3:

To enhance External Communication & Network

Achievements

1. Re-structure the Organization Chart

In order to develop a systematic way to enhance our school image in the community, a new Administrative Committee (External Network) was created with a group of teachers and led by a senior teacher.

2. Communication with the stakeholders (PTA)

Three parent sharing seminars were held for our parents. At the beginning of the school term, a seminar on the overview of school based curriculum was held. Through the presentation of the principal, vice principals and subject panels, parents grasped an understanding of the characteristics of the curriculum. The other two were held in January and June 2013, the focus was on sharing of students' achievement, learning process and outcome. These seminars were well-received and appreciated by parents.

Besides the official gatherings, parents were happy to join the subject events like Poetry Café, Acting Corner and Music Contest. They were glad to see their children's learning process throughout the year.

3. School website

In order to make use of the school homepage to enhance communication among stakeholders and community, the format of our school website was improved. With the launch of a Green School policy, the e-circular was piloted in the 2nd term. This also encouraged more parents to visit our website regularly.

4. Publication of school newsletter (WF Gazette)

Three-editions of WF Gazette were published this year. An improved way was developed in collecting photos and information among teachers. Teachers trained a group of students as young reporters who nurtured a sense of responsibility in publishing newsletters.

5. Graduate Network via setting up the "WF Club" (和富之友)

A club was set up to recruit teachers, graduates and parents. The first social gathering was held in March 2013. Over 200 graduates, parents, teachers and non-teaching staff joined the BBQ Night at school. Similar events will be organized at least once a year for all graduates in order to enhance a sense of belonging among our graduates, teachers, former staff and parents.

Reflection

- a. It is more efficient to organize teams responsible for external network. Most teachers have little experience in creating publications, hence, systematic training for teachers is needed.
- b. Positive feedback was received from parents. We will keep organizing the Parents' Meet three times a year. Besides seminars, parents' workshops and training courses will also be planned for the next academic year.
- c. The school website will be periodically updated throughout the year. School Apps is another potential means to enhance the communication with parents. More information collection and cost analysis have to be done to explore the possibilities.
- d. More graduates were visiting teachers during school hours. It was suggested that a common room be provided for graduates, to help cultivate a sense of belonging to our school. However, as space was limited, no spare room was available.
- e. PTA members requested a bigger room for social functions of parent volunteers. This will be decided upon as each event is planned.

Our Learning and Teaching

Professional development workshops for teachers were conducted throughout the year to enhance the capability of teachers in developing students' high order thinking skills. Workshops on Higher Order Thinking Skills, Balanced Literacy Approach in English as well as the Concretized Thinking Method in Math were organized for teachers. In order to reinforce the effectiveness of what the teachers learnt in the workshops, weekly team planning and subject sharing sessions were also provided in teachers' timetable. All teachers agreed that the workshops as well as the chance to collaborate on unit plan designs among teachers enhanced their teaching effectiveness.

Reading integrated vocabulary building, comprehension and writing skills. Our English teachers were equipped in the curriculum design workshops. More chances were given to our students to express and apply the knowledge learnt, which resulted in fluency and proficiency of their spoken English.

The discovery and inquiry approach was applied in Mathematics, Science and General Studies. Teachers deepened the understanding of different learning styles in order to enhance the teaching effectiveness.

School provided a platform for students to enjoy a wider learning experience. Besides formal lessons, a variety of school and subject events were organized to enrich the learning journey of students. Parents were invited to attend some of these events. Highlighted activities included Spelling Bee, Poetry Café, Writers' Conference, Acting Corner, Math Genius, Math and Science Carnival and GS Quest.

Support for Student Development

In order to enhance students' sense of responsibility, a series of service trainings were organized for all P2 to P6 students. However the P6 service learning trip to Mainland China, which was scheduled in May, was cancelled due to the "flu scare" in China.

- P2 served the Kindergarten students
- P3 participated in Beach Cleaning
- P4 served the Mentally Retarded
- P5 served the Aged People
- P6 served the Poor in Mainland China (cancelled)

Over 80% of students showed a positive attitude towards serving others (noted by teachers and students). After receiving feedback from teachers, it was decided that service learning for the same grade (5 classes) may be held on the same day in the next academic year to facilitate planning.

Besides service training, leadership training such as class monitor and prefect training were provided for the whole school. More than 90% of students joined the activities. Over 80% of students showed a positive attitude towards serving others (from teachers' observation and students' self-reflection)

"Buddy Match" was reinforced in a more systematic way this year. Students were paired up with schoolmates from different levels for 3 consecutive years (P1 with P4 students, P2 with P5 students, P6 with P3 students). The elder buddies from upper classes were trained in leadership roles and assigned to take care of their younger buddies. In the meantime, the younger buddies gradually developed a sense of belonging and adapted to school life. Regular House meetings bonded children and teachers with further established friendship and stimulated their motivation to excel.

The school provided support for students on a whole school basis. Every teacher wore different hats as either a language teacher, other subject teacher as well as a discipline teacher. Their collective reflection on individual student behavior and learning provided the best support for our youngsters. For programme details, please see Appendix 2.

Student Performance

The school based curriculum was tailored to equip our students with the skills required for learning and life.

Their academic performance was measured by the TSA for Basic competency skills at P3 and P6. The P6 TSA results surpassed the norm in Hong Kong. 99.2% of our Primary 6 students got allocated to their first 3 choices of secondary schools.

Our students showed good potential and caliber, and were vibrant and enthusiastic about learning. They displayed competence in using English and Putonghua and had good rapport with their teachers and fellow schoolmates.

Feedback on Future Planning

Staff development will be continuously one of our foci for the school. It aims to coach our staff a collective effort, a shared vision, a strong sense of mission as well as a sense of belonging. The 4 working committees creates an equal opportunity for leadership training, as it empowers the teachers to contribute to the school as a team and be proud of their achievements.

Enhancing the 16 Habits of Mind enables teachers to widen their scope of thinking and develop their good work habits conscientiously. Teachers are able to create ways of reinforcing these good work habits among students so that all stakeholders become ingrained habits for problem solving, learning and facing everyday life.

Cultivating and sustaining the love of reading remains one of the main concerns in the curriculum design. The development of reading for meaning and reading with a purpose are the core objectives. Teachers have to work with the librarian to sustain children's interest inside the classroom. We have to make sure that our children come into contact with good reading material of different genres in the classroom and outside school. The period of uninterrupted, sustained, silent reading (USSR), recitation of poems during lesson changeover and sharing during morning assemblies have to be sustained as school routine which give purpose to build up the child's confidence in public speaking. The Language curriculum is developing on the right track. Teachers work very hard during collaborative lesson planning time in familiarizing with the authentic teaching material. However, we still need to spend time in the writing skills.

We continue to nurture our children's awareness of their national identity and reinforce the teaching of morals, civic mindedness and to make our children be proud of their own identity. We should let them know more about themselves, their country, the current affairs as well as the world. We endeavour to provide the learning environment for their holistic development with assemblies. We want children to co-exist harmoniously and have opportunities for bonding. The House League successfully builds up a sense of belonging and responsibility among children. Prefects and student ambassadors enjoy serving the others in the school. More relevant trainings should be provided. In order to reinforce the House League system, further trainings for both teachers and students would be desirable.

The School-based Inclusive Education is another area of concern for school development. The School-based Support Group of Teachers (SBST) oversees students with learning differences. Diagnostic testing will be done at the beginning of school term to identify children's need and sufficient support will be given in the last lesson every day. The support team also provides various services to meet students' individual education plan and build their confidence in success, for instance, monitoring system, support groups and programmes. It is believed that students will dispel self doubts and be reinforced to achieve their potential in every aspect. This area should be further strengthened and thus, will be the focus of our plan in the next school year.
