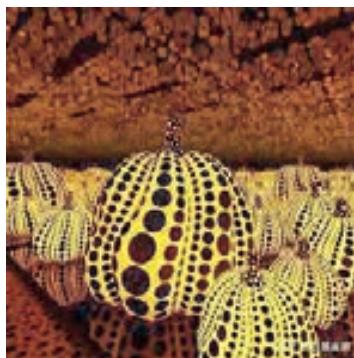
Art Movement: Contemporary Art

Artist: Henri Matisse

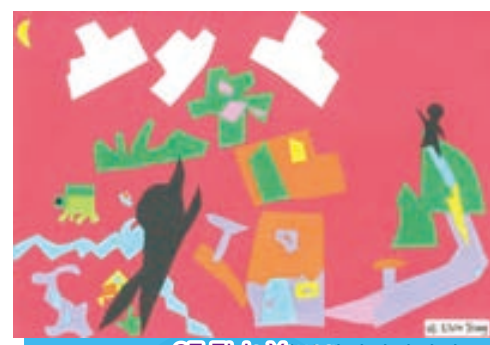

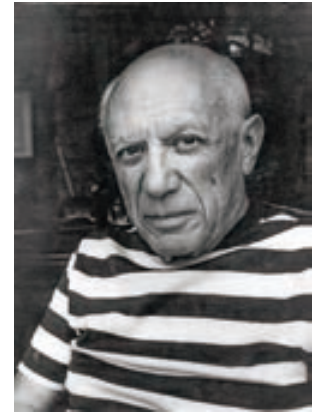
Art Movement: Cubism

Artist: Pablo Picasso

Artist: Evgen Matza

Ex Libris is a Latin phrase that translates to “from the books,” and it is commonly used to denote ownership of a book. The tradition dates back to the Renaissance period in Europe, when the printing press was first invented and books became more widely available.

Learning Objective:

Students can explore the art of Ex Libris by creating their own personalised bookplates. Using plastic carving tools, students can carve their designs onto a plastic board and then print them onto their sketchbooks.
